

OPENING OF THE HOLY DOOR OF ST PETER'S BASILICA

The Opening of the Holy Door of St Peter's Basilica, which will take place on Christmas Eve, 2024, signifies the official commencement of the Jubilee Year: Pilgrims of Hope. It will be first of four Holy Doors in Rome that will be opened during the Jubilee Year.

TEACHING

From *Incarnationis Mysterium*, the Bull of Indiction of the Great Jubilee of the Year 2000 (Pope John Paul II):

"8. [The Holy Door] evokes the passage from sin to grace which every Christian is called to accomplish. Jesus said: "I am the door" (Jn 10:7), in order to make it clear that no one can come to the Father except through him. This designation which Jesus applies to himself testifies to the fact that he alone is the Saviour sent by the Father. There is only one way that opens wide the entrance into the life of communion with God: this is Jesus, the one and absolute way to salvation. To him alone can the words of the Psalmist be applied in full truth: "This is the door of the Lord where the just may enter" (Ps 118:20).

"To focus upon the door is to recall the responsibility of every believer to cross its threshold. To pass through that door means to confess that Jesus Christ is Lord; it is to strengthen faith in him in order to live the new life which he has given us. It is a decision which presumes freedom to choose and also the courage to leave something behind, in the knowledge that what is gained is divine life (cf. Mt 13:44-46)."
